



## **Spanish II**

### **Course Description**

In this Spanish II course, a continuation of Spanish I, students will learn listening, speaking, reading and writing skills through activities that are based on pedagogically proven methods of foreign language instruction. Throughout the 10 instructional units, students learn to express themselves using an increasing vocabulary, present-tense verbs, articles, and adjectives. Grammar is introduced and practiced in innovative and interesting ways with a variety of learning styles in mind. Culture is integrated throughout the course to help learners focus on the Spanish speaking world, its cultures, people, geographical locations, and histories. Students will work on a project per unit to demonstrate their comprehension of the content given.

The course is aligned to the national Foreign Language standards and provides a way to focus on the five important aspects of foreign language instruction: communication, culture, connections, comparisons and community. These are the "Five C's of the Foreign Language Education" as outlined in Standards for Foreign Language Learning: Preparing for the 21st Century.
